In the event the proposed budget fails and the Board adopts a contingent budget, additional reductions in the amount of \$2,075,965 would be required. The reductions would include the traditional non-contingency items (see below) and an additional reduction due to a new requirement contained in the Property Tax Cap law where the Administrative Component can't exceed the prior Administrative Component. Under a contingent budget, the tax levy for 2017-18 could not exceed the current 2016-17 tax levy.








## TOTAL COHORT RESULTS IN SECONDARY-LEVEL MATHEMATICS AFTER FOUR YEARS OF INSTRUCTION




